Bachelor degree containing at least one year of full-time equivalent studies *relevant to one or more key learning areas of the primary school curriculum.

The key learning areas are:

• English, Mathematics, Science and technology, Human society and its environment, Creative arts, Personal development, health and physical education.

Master of Teaching (Secondary)

> How long is the course?

2 years full-time; 18 months accelerated

3-4 years part-time

> When can I start the course?

- February
- July

What are the entry requirements?

Applicants may be admitted to the Master of Teaching (Secondary) upon successful completion of an accredited Bachelor degree with a study in a designated area related to the first school subject they wish to teach.

The key learning areas are:

• English, Dance, Drama, Geography, History, Mathematics, Studies of Religion, Science, Business.

- Professional Experience I (15 days)
- Professional Experience II (20 days)

What is Professional Experience?

 The purpose of Professional Experience is to provide teacher education students (TES), through immersion in a school, with an understanding of the structures and practices of contemporary Primary or Secondary education. Professional Experience provides TES with opportunities to: observe and engage professionally with teachers; understand students and how they learn; and implement effective teaching and learning strategies through classroom teaching and active reflection on their own teaching practice. The TES will experience first-hand the intersecting roles and activities of the school, the community, and the teacher in the classroom.



Assessment for Graduate Teachers AfGT

- The AfGT is the instrument being used by a number of universities, in a Consortium led by Melbourne University, as an assessment to demonstrate that graduating teachers are 'classroom ready'.
- The Assessment for Graduate Teachers is a summative, capstone teaching performance assessment. It is designed to assess a Pre-Service Teacher's (PST) teaching as measured by the Australian Professional Standards for Teachers at Graduate level (AITSL, 2018).
- The AfGT is completed during the final Professional Experience



AfGT

The AfGT has been designed with consideration of the complex, intellectual work of teaching.

The AfGT has four elements:

Element 1: Planning for Teaching and Learning

Element 2: Analysing Teaching Practice

Element 3: Assessing for Impact on Student Learning

Element 4: Expanding Practice (Situational Judgement)
